Program Description

Global Aging and Social Policies—Study Abroad China program is a May semester course that integrates book learning with real world experiences. The first week of class in the May semester will be held at GSU downtown campus to provide a background knowledge regarding issues of demography, global aging, and social policies in the contexts of the U.S. and Chinese cultures and societies. Students will read and discuss comparatively about work and retirement, pension and social insurance, social services and long term care in both China and the U.S. Each student will prepare a power point presentation of a site visit of an aging service organization in Atlanta and will present in class before heading to China at the end of the one-week class. And this presentation will be shared with Chinese students in Beijing and Chengdu.

In the second week, students will be visiting Renmin University in Beijing, attending classes, conferences in Beijing on issues of aging and long term care. Students will also travel to visit the Great Wall of China, Forbidden City, Summer Palace, etc. In the third week, students will spend one-week in Chengdu, Sichuan Province. Our GSU students will be paired with students at the Southwestern University of Finance & Economics to learn and discuss major social policies affecting aging and long term care. Plenty of opportunities will be provided for students to travel and site-seeing independently and with Chinese students.

Accommodations

Participants will stay in a comfortable, double-occupancy hotel near Renmin University in Beijing; and a hostel on the campus of Southwestern University of Finance and Economics. Both hotels have air-conditioning in the summer, western toilet, and a shower in the room.

Program Cost

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements. **The program cost is tentatively set at \$2200 PLUS regular Georgia State University tuition and fees.** An additional \$1400 for airplane tickets and \$200-500 out-ofpocket expenditure is anticipated for a total cost of approximately \$4000. Non-resident/out of state students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost.
