Program Description

We embark on an exploration of cultural icons and contemporary businesses in a vast one-time-zone country filled with fascinating paradoxes. We visit epic and enchanting cities, the Three Gorges Dam, and a one-day cruise on the Li River. Cross-cultural business commonalities and differences are studied using economic, political, legal, social, and cultural facets, while integrating theory with practice relative to accounting, management and international business issues. We will visit a variety of organizations in Beijing, Suzhou, Wuhan and Shanghai with the opportunity to examine:

- The role of business in society
- Public-private sector relationships
- Strategic management
- Foreign business valuation
- Business and economic development
- Transfer pricing
- Foreign taxation
- Human behavior in the workplace in developed vs. emerging markets

This monumental journey integrates business with culture, urban with rural, global industry challengers with the oldest living civilization, and creates an opportunity of a lifetime. The prospect of interviewing managers in China adds a significant dimension to this study abroad program. Emphasis is placed on understanding and applying management and accounting principles in the cross-national context. Many students regard this program as their most fulfilling university learning experience. A pivotal program, promising an impactful, interdisciplinary, immersion experience in which you will cultivate cross-cultural literacy and leadership skills across professional and personal dimensions.
