

JAMAICA CULTURAL IMMERSION IN EDUCATION

Maymester Study Abroad Program: May 21–29, 2016

SPONSORED BY THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

3 SEMESTER HOURS

THE PROGRAM

Jamaica Cultural Immersion in Education, a study abroad program, offered during the Maymester 2016, will engage students in an international cultural immersion experience. Students will examine the political, educational, sociocultural, and economic factors that contribute to the various issues within the Jamaican educational system. Students will participate in a variety of cultural experiences and also work within local and regional schools and community organizations. Students will benefit from lectures, as well as field study, data collection, and research within Jamaica. Students will engage in two different classroom components. The first half of the program will meet at GSU. Students will be introduced to education in a Jamaican context as they develop their research interests abroad. In the second half of the program, students will travel to lamaica for nine days.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Participants will stay in comfortable, multi-occupancy single gender rooms in a hotel in Kingston, Jamaica, which is not too far from The MICO University College, some major cultural attractions, schools, the Ministry of Education, and the University of the West Indies. There are inexpensive restaurants nearby as well as a cafeteria on the MICO's campus for students.

ELIGIBILITY

The program is open to undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students who are taking courses in the College of Education and/or College of Arts and Sciences. Program size is limited and participation is contingent upon acceptance by the Program Director.

CREDITS AND COURSES

Students who successfully complete the program's (EDUC 3333, or EDCI 4400, or EDUC 7777, or EDMT 8420) courses will receive three semester hours of course credit at Georgia State University. Undergraduate students should register for EDUC 3333 and graduate students should register for EDCI 4400 or EDUC 7777 or EDMT 8420. Students from other institutions should follow their institution's regulations concerning transfer credits.

COST

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements. The program cost is tentatively set at \$2,500, PLUS regular Georgia State University tuition and fees. Non-resident/out-of-state students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost.

FUNDING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Georgia State University students are eligible to apply for the IEF Study Abroad Scholarship/Georgia State University Foundation Scholarship and may be eligible to apply for the Global Experience Scholarship.
