Name of Program: Human Rights in Argentina: From Dictatorship to Democracy (1976-Today)

Location(s) of Program: Cordoba and Buenos Aires, Argentina

Dates of Program: 14 May 2015 - 2 June 2015

Program Description: This program will take place in Cordoba and Buenos Aires, Argentina. It will be late autumn, so students should expect some brisk temperatures as low as 40 and up to 80 degrees Fahrenheit; however, typical temperatures are quite moderate, ranging from 60 to 70 degrees at that time of year. During the program there will be lots of walking – generally 2 miles per day. We will be mostly in the two cities and much of the walking will take place on city sidewalks. There will be several excursions to small towns and to historic sites outside of both cities. We will spend one day hiking about 5 miles through mountainous terrain. The trail is very clear and no climbing is necessary, but there will be steep inclines and sharp descents. Previous hiking experience is not required; it is a tiring day, but even inexperienced hikers have done very well. Throughout the program, participants will travel by plane, train, subway, and bus. The buses are generally modern and well-ventilated. One or two bus rides (day trips) will involve bumpy and curvy country roads for part of the trip. There will be one over-night (about 8 hour) bus ride when the group moves from Cordoba to Buenos Aires; the bus we will take is quite luxurious: seats recline all the way back, evening and morning meals are included.
