FRONTIERS IN BIOMEDICINE

Summer Study Abroad Program: June 26-July 14 2015

Sponsored by the Biology Department and China Medical University, Taiwan

The Program

Cancer and infectious diseases are health challenges of global proportions. This course will examine issues surrounding the causes, the treatment and the prevention of these maladies. We will take advantage of our location on the China Medical University (CMU) campus in Taichung, Taiwan to learn about contemporary Western and traditional Chinese approaches to maintaining health and managing illness. GSU students will learn in classes taught in English along with Taiwanese students, allowing for cross-cultural interactions and sharing of perspectives. We anticipate that participation in this course will stimulate student thinking about diverse causes and solutions to global health issues.

Taichung is in the central region of Taiwan. It is a vibrant city a short drive from beautiful Sun Moon Lake and historic Lukang village. At the end of our trip we will travel to Taiwan's cosmopolitan capital Taipei to enjoy its cultural sites including the unforgettable National Palace Museum.

ELIGIBILITY The program is open to undergraduate and graduate students who meet all academic requirements of the Georgia State University College of Arts and Sciences. The completion of BIOL 2108 or equivalent with a GPA of at least 3.0 is required. *Program size is limited and participation is contingent upon acceptance by the Program Director*.


