STUDY ABROAD

Through this unique interdisciplinary course, we will explore the cultural histories, identities and education of South Africa and the United States. This course is designed to help students understand the power and purpose of education and literacy and the impact education has on transforming communities that have been historically marginalized—particularly people of color from linguistically and culturally diverse backgrounds. The course will focus on sociohistorical and sociopolitical perspectives of literacy and education and is designed to explore various views of literacy and the ways literacy praxis is applied to classrooms. Overall, students will understand their own positions as literate beings and the various roles that literacy and education plays in the lives of others. The trip will include visits to private, public and charter schools across different K-12 contexts. Students will also visit the University of Johannesburg and Durban University of Technology. In addition to school and university visits, students will visit cultural sites that include Nelson Mandela's home, the apartheid museum, elephant and lion sanctuaries, the most southwestern point/tip of Africa, Table Mountain, Robben Island, the Phoenix Settlement (Mahatma Gandhi's home), historic monuments and prisons that held political prisoners. Academic experiences include readings, dialogue, journals, field observations, cultural interviews and a digital photo project.

Accommadations

Participants will stay comfortably in double-occupancy 3-star hotels in Johannesburg, Cape Town, and Durban. In Johannesburg, students will stay close to our host university—University of Johannesburg. In Cape Town and Durban, students will stay in hotels along the coast, located in walking distance of the ocean, cultural sites, craft markets and other local sites. All hotels are close to the schools, museums, and partnering universities and are accessible by local transit.

Undergraduate students should register for EDCU 3333 and graduate students should register for EDCU 7777. Course substitutions for other departments may be available and will be negotiated on an individual basis. Students from other institutions should follow their institution's regulations concerning transfer credits.

Program Cost

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements. The program cost is tentatively set at **\$3,550**, PLUS regular Georgia State University tuition and fees.
