

Program Description

The study abroad program Early Literacy Practices in Varying Educational Contexts will provide an international opportunity for students to engage with South African educators and K-8 students in a number of socioeconomically and culturally diverse Western Cape Schools. Through these opportunities, participants will be introduced to the history and literacies of South African people. They will also have the opportunity to reflect upon literacy practices in both South Africa and The United States, their own literacy, and the role literacy plays in their lives. Participants will be immersed in daily Cape Town culture, go on safari at Kruger National Park, and visit other attractions like Robben Island and Table Mountain.

Courses and Credits

Participants who successfully complete the program's ECEE 4700 (undergraduate) or ECEE 8000 (graduate) will receive 3 semester hours of course credit at Georgia State University. Undergraduate students should register for ECEE 4700 and graduate students should register for ECEE 8000. Students from other institutions should follow their institution's regulations concerning transfer credits

Program Cost

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements. **The program cost is tentatively set at \$4,500, PLUS regular Georgia State University tuition and fees.** Non-resident/out-of-state students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost.
