


#### **Application Information**



Schedule: one class prior to the trip will be held on GSU's campus on a date to be announced. The students will fly from Atlanta to Paris on March 10, arriving Saturday, March 11. Daily classes will be held in the mornings with group outings and free time in the afternoons. The group will take a high speed train to Lourdes (six hours away) on March 14 returning on the morning of March 18, and then flying out on March 18 back to Atlanta.

Students will learn about the central role of pilgrimage in the religious lives of the pilgrims, the cultural contexts of the pilgrimage sites, and how to study a religious practice using interdisciplinary methods. Students will keep a pilgrimage journal and write a final paper upon their return to Atlanta. While some of the days will be organized around the class and group excursions, students will also have plenty of time for individual interests.

#### Accommodations

Housing in Paris will be in apartments located close to the city center. Housing in Lourdes will be in group hotel rooms located 4 blocks from the pilgrimage site.

#### **Program Cost**

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements. The program cost is tentatively set at \$1875, PLUS regular Georgia State University tuition and fees. Non-resident/out-of-state students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost.
