THE PROGRAM

Mathematical Music Theory is an interdisciplinary endeavor. Music intersects with mathematics, physics, neuroscience, computer science, psychology, education and business and is an essential part of other arts. We'll learn how to work with "mathemusical" problems to see how setting a musical problem in a mathematical framework can give rise to new mathematical results and new musical constructions.

From May 17-26 we'll visit the East Chinese University of Science and Technology, a key Chinese research university with a beautiful campus, an elegant environment and green scenery. We'll be living in the university dormitories and going to class with local Mathematical Music Theory students. We'll join them for excursions together as well: a 12-hour trip to Hangzhou, one of the most renowned, prosperous and beautiful cities of China, by bullet train, and a Hop On Hop Off Double Decker Bus Tour in Shanghai, including entry into the Jade Buddha Temple, a one-hour cruise on the Huangpu River and a visit to Madame Tussaud's Shanghai.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Participants will stay in one of the dormitories for international students. This dormitory has its own cafeteria, a room with washing machines and dryers, and spacious, comfortable bedrooms. Campus is within walking distance of commercial and tourist areas of Shanghai.

Disability Accommodations

Students with documented disabilities who may need accommodations during their study abroad experience should discuss these needs with the program director and the Office of Disability Services at the time of application.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to all undergraduate and graduate students who meet the academic requirements for the course according to the Department of Mathematics and Statistics and/or the School of Music, as the course is cross-registered. Transient students are welcome. Program size is limited and participation is contingent upon acceptance by the program director.

CREDITS AND COURSES

Undergraduate students should register for Math 4998 or Music 4890, and graduate students should register for Math 8800 or Music 6890. Participants who successfully complete their course will receive 3 semester hours of course credit at Georgia State University. Students from other institutions should follow their institution's regulations concerning transfer credits.

COST

Program cost may increase at any time according to currency fluctuations, airline fuel surcharges and changing travel arrangements. The program cost is tentatively set at \$863. However, because this is a Study Abroad with Peers Program, the first 10 accepted and confirmed students will receive a \$1,000 IEF scholarship, which covers the cost and leaves about \$135 for expenses. Therefore, the cost for the first 10 students will consist of the plane fare

(usually between \$1,000-1,500) and regular Georgia State tuition and fees. Non-resident/out-of-state students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost

Price Includes

- Ground transportation
- Meals and housing
- Health/Evacuation/Repatriation insurance Excursions:
- Hangzhou by bullet train from Shanghai. Price includes transportation to the train station, the bullet train tickets, the van driver and guide, and lunch.
- Hop On Hop Off Double Decker Bus Tour in Shanghai. Price includes entry into the Jade Buddha Temple, a one-hour cruise on the Huangpu River and entry to Madame Tussaud's Shanghai.

Price Does NOT Include

- Georgia State tuition and fees
- Plane fare to Shanghai
- Passport
- Personal expenses and excess baggage charges
