APPROXIMATE DATES

Based in Strasbourg, France, with trips to
Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany.

Fall Semester: Late August to mid-December.

Spring Semester: Early January to the end of April/early May.

Once students arrive in Strasbourg, an orientation and
registration assistance for classes will be provided by
on-site staff.

THE PROGRAM

The EU Studies program brings together a broad range of courses, including political science, economics, business, management, history, art, languages, literature and culture.

Students will attend classes taught in English at France's largest university – the University of Strasbourg.

Multiple field trips and visits to EU institutions in France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany are an integral part of the entire semester program.

The program is offered under the supervision of Georgia State University, in collaboration with the University of Strasbourg and in partnership with its on-site provider CEPA Europe.

Why live in a dorm when you can live in a castle? Students enrolled in the EU Studies Program will be housed in the Château de Pourtalès, a 250-year-old castle nestled in a beautiful park less than three miles from the historic city center of Strasbourg.

The castle has dormitory rooms, classrooms, lounges, a computer lab, Wi-Fi access throughout, a library, laundry facilities, a breakfast room and TV lounge. Recreational facilities are on the premises and nearby.

Disability Accommodations

Students with documented disabilities who may need accommodations during their study abroad experience should discuss these needs with the program director and the Office of Disability Services at the time of application.

EXCURSIONS

In addition to coursework, students enjoy excursions to important historical, political and cultural sites as part of their program fee. The extensive cultural and professional program provides you with many wonderful opportunities to learn more about Europe and the European Union beyond books and the classroom.

For Example:

Professional excursions to important institutions:

France: Visit the European Parliament, the Council of Europe, the European Court of Human Rights and the EURO Institute.

Germany: Visit the Bundesbank (German Central Bank), the German Stock Exchange and the German Federal Constitutional Court (Bundesverfassungsgericht) in Karlsruhe.

ELIGIBILITY

The program is open to undergraduate and graduate students. All majors are welcome to apply. Minimum 2.5 GPA required. All courses are taught in English. French language skills are not required. Program size is limited

and participation is contingent upon acceptance by the program director.

CREDITS AND COURSES

Many courses will be offered covering subjects such as political science, European Union studies, economics, business, public management, European history and culture, and elementary/advanced courses in French language.

All courses are taught in English. For students with sufficient French skills, courses in French are available. Online courses in EU Studies are also available to participating students through Georgia State. Students from other institutions should follow their institution's regulations concerning transfer credits.

COST

Program cost may vary at any time according to currency fluctuations and changing travel arrangements.

The program cost is set at \$8,995 **PLUS** regular Georgia State tuition and fees. Non-resident students will pay in-state tuition plus a \$250 fee in addition to the program cost.

Price Includes

- Housing (double-occupancy, shared bathrooms)
- Breakfast daily, plus 5 additional group meals
- Student ID card and use of the university cafeteria
- 2 night/3 day trip to Brussels/Luxembourg
- Public transportation pass for Strasbourg
- Transfer from Strasbourg to the Château
- "Survival French" course (20 hours)
- Ground transportation and entrance fees for excursions
- On-site staff member at the Château
- Wi-Fi, use of washer/dryer, student kitchen, use of bikes
- Health/Evacuation/Repatriation insurance

Price Does NOT Include

- Georgia State tuition and fees
- Round-trip airfare
- Passport/visa fees
- Personal expenses, excess baggage charges, cell phone minutes

Pay Georgia State tuition and fees separately by university's registration deadline.

FUNDING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Georgia State students are eligible to apply for the IEF Study Abroad Scholarship/Georgia State University Foundation Scholarship and may be eligible to apply for the Global Experience Scholarship.
